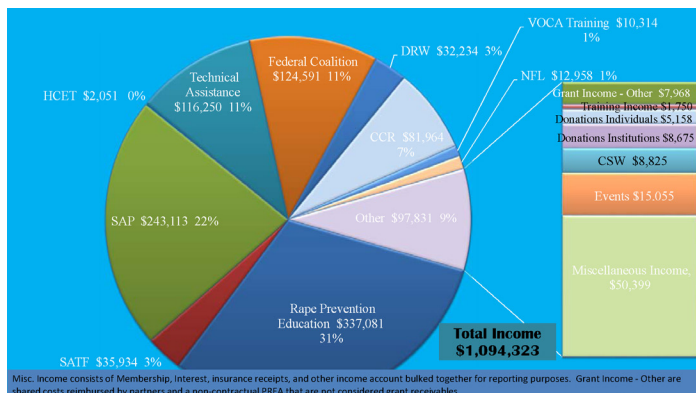

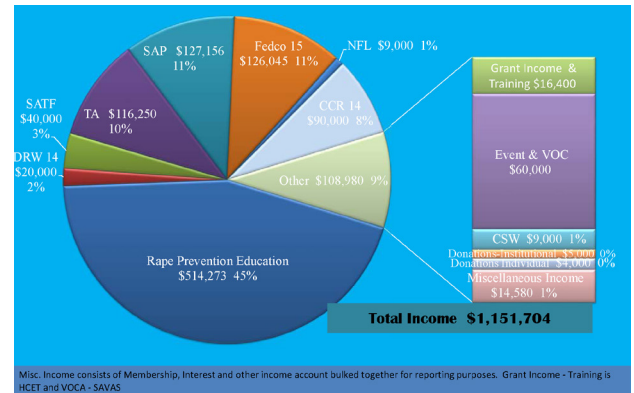

### Technical Assistance (TA)

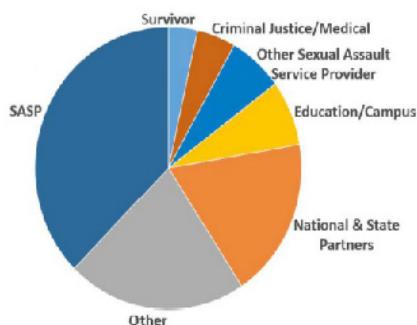

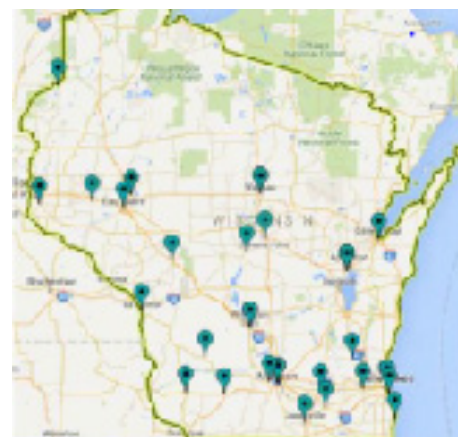

In-person training locations

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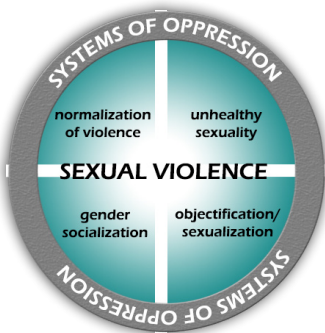
### ALL\* Work-Group

### Victim Accompaniment Bill (SB 323 / AB 430)

- WCASA provides testimony in support of bill, which was signed into law April 2016
- The bill grants survivors of sexual assault the right to be accompanied by an advocate at key stages of criminal justice process.
- Unanimously voted out of Senate committee
