If adults are not comfortable talking about sex or using certain words about bodies, then how comfortable do you imagine youth, of any age, would be to go to that adult when they need help or have questions? This session will tackle the importance of talking to kids openly, and respectfully, to foster their bodily autonomy and healthy boundaries and how adults have the power to normalize language and conversations that build protective factors in sexual violence prevention.
