

AI Use Policy

Purpose

1. Guiding Principles

- Making decisions about services, eligibility, or client needs without human oversight
- Replacing community engagement or survivor input in program design or evaluation
- Generating content without staff review for bias, accuracy, or tone

4. Human Oversight and Review

All AI-generated outputs must be:

- Fact-checked for accuracy

- Reviewed for inclusive, trauma-informed, and non-biased language
- Modified or discarded if they do not meet our quality or ethical standards

5. Staff Training and Support
